STC's Ski Club, sponsored by the Recreation Association, has been chosen by the National Industrial Recreation Association to be awarded a Certificate of Excellence at their Annual Awards Meeting on May 19, 1979.

FIRST 1950 SHIPPED TO NCC

STC's most recent contribution to the advancement of tape technology, the 1950 Tape Drive Series, has been shipped to its official unveiling at the National Computer Conference in New York City, June 4-7.

The 1935/1950 tape subsystem is the latest complement to the 1900 family of high performance tape subsystems designed specifically for the OEM mini-computer market. This new subsystem offers the unique flexibility of three speeds and three densities in the same

basic unit. For example, a customer may operate the 1935/1950 subsystem in all three densities — NRZI, PE or GCR at speeds of 50, 75 or 125 inches per second.

This is part of the more than twenty features not found in any other mini tape system on the market.

The 1935/50 subsystem forms the backbone of a purchase agreement recently signed between STC and another large corporation. The 1935/1950 subsystem will be displayed in STC's booth at

the NCC. Jesse Aweida, President and Chairman of STC, will make the official announcement at a special press conference.
